Composting and Worms

- get food scraps out of landfill
- make your own healthy soils
- everything you could possibly want to know about how to successfully run a compost bin and a worm farm
- problem solving

Beginner's Vegie Gardening

- learn a simple method of starting a new vegie garden
- learn the difference between organic gardening and toxic chemical gardening
- learn about the connection between healthy gardens and healthy people

Self-watering Garden Beds

- an exciting workshop on building and managing a wicking bed a self-watering garden
- build your own small wicking bed at the workshop & take it home
- learn about available commercial wicking systems

- Manage food abundance/excesses and enjoy produce out of season
- take home a sample of what you create

Pruning & Propagation *NEW*

- learn pruning techniques
- understand the theory behind a variety of propagation techniques including cuttings, layering, division, budding and grafting
- use this practical workshop to create more new plants in your garden or to share/swap with others

Native Bees (learn about and manage them) *NEW*

- explore the different types of Native Bees and the vital work they do in pollinating plants in our gardens
- learn how to take care of native bees and how to collect the honey they produce
- observe how to split the hive each year
