Composting and Worms^

- · get food scraps out of landfill

Beginner's Vegie Gardening^

Pruning & Propagation *NEW* (September)

- learn pruning techniques
- understand the theory behind a variety of propagation techniques including cuttings, layering, division, budding and grafting
- use this practical workshop to create more new plants in your garden or to share/swap with others

Native Bees - learn about and manage them (November)

- explore the different types of Native Bees and the vital work they do in pollinating plants in our gardens
- learn how to take care of native bees and how to collect the honey they produce
- observe how to split the hive each year
